# Tulip Tango Tablerunner 

By Colleen Tauke | Finished Size: Approximately 13-1/4" x 40-1/4"

## Yardage

1/8 yd dark pink
1/3 yd medium pink
1/8 light pink
3/4 yd white
1/4 yd medium green
1/4 yd dark green - binding
1/2 yd backing

## Supplies

## Rotary Cutter

Cutting Mat
8-1/2" X 24-1/2" and 6-1/2" square or similar Fabric marking pen/pencil
1/4" seam marker (optional but useful) Scissors
Pins
Iron and pressing mat
Batting 18" x 45"

## Cutting

Dark pink (12) 1-1/2" squares

Med pink (3) 6-1/4" squares
(12) $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares

Light pink (5) 1-1/2" squares
White
(6) 6-1/4" squares
(36) 2-1/2" squares
(16) 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles - sashing

(12) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
(12) 1-1/2" squares

Med green (3) 6-1/4" squares

Dark green (3) 2-1/2" x WOF - binding

## Construction

Flower corner unit - collect the (12) white $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares, (12) white $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and (12) dark pink 1-1/2" squares. Place one white and one dark pink square RST and join with a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam. Press seam toward the darker fabric. Next, join one white rectangle to one side of the previously created unit. Note the diagram for paper alignment. Press seam toward the rectangle. Make (12) flower corner units.


Collect the (3) 6-1/4" med. pink, med. green and white squares. Mark the wrong side of the white squares with diagonally lines in both directions. Match each white square RST with a med. pink or med. green square. Stitch $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on each side, of the marked lines as shown below by the broken line. Cut the squares apart, vertically, horizontally and diagonally in both directions shown by the red lines. Repeat this process for each pair of squares.

Cutting lines

Press all seam allowances toward the darker fabric.
This will yield (24) HST in med. green/white leaf units and
(24) HST in med. pink/white petal units.

Trim all HST to 2-1/2"

Arrange the flower corner units, leaf units, petal units and remaining (36) 2-1/2" white squares and the (12) 2-1/2" med. pink squares using the block diagram that follows. Join units into rows and then join rows to complete the block. The block will measure 6-1/2" square. Make (12) Tulip Tango blocks.


Row 1


Row 2


Row 3

Join (2) Tulip Tango blocks with a (1) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ white rectangle. For rectangle placement note the diagram. Press seams toward the sashing. Make (6) matching Tulip Tango rows.


Using the remaining (10) 1-1/2" $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ white rectangles and the (5) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ light pink squares, make (5) sashing rows shown below. Press seam allowance toward the sashing.


Alternate and join the Tulip Tango rows and sashing rows. Press seam allowances toward the sashing rows.

Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Apply binding. Your Tulip Tango tablerunner is complete.

## Tulip Garden

57" x 57"
(64) 6-1/2" blocks

Made using approximately 5.3 X the table runner yardage and cutting
Add:
$1 / 3$ yd - inner border
1 yd - outer border
5/8 yd - binding


## Tulip Ribbons

$71 " \times 85^{\prime \prime}$
(120) 6-1/2" blocks

Made using approximately 10X the table runner yardage and cutting
Add:
$3 / 8$ yd - inner border
1-1/3 yd - outer border
3/4 yd - binding
