This pattern is written in US terms and is designed to be flexible!

- You can use any type of yarn.
- Use a hook size to your choosing.

CH3 counts as first DC throughout.

This pattern uses Poppers but you can use Puff, Clusters or Poppers. It is your choice :)

Adrianna used Alize Ombre Bella Batik 7414, 1000m with a 3.5mm hook

Jennifer used 740g Spotlight Value Ball Yarn with a 5 mm hook and her blanket is 110 cm square.

Magdalena used approximately 600g of acrylic yarn using a 4mm hook. Her finished size was 150 x 150 centimetres.

Mira Dixon


Mira used approximately 1800m of Lola yarn using a 3.5mm hook. Her blanket is 105cm square.

POP 5 DC Lazy Popcorn (or regular Popcorn)

STITCH NOTES:

HOW TO DO A LAZY POPCORN

Lazy Popcorns are fabulous. You don't need to remove your hook or close the popcorn on the row you're working!


To make the lazy popcorns, on the row you are making them, simply do your 5 DC into required stitch and then continue on. Don't close the popcorn.

On the next row... use the FPDC to close your Popcorn from the row below.


PART 1 - Our Elegant Journey Begins....

Part 2 can be repeated until the blanket is the size you want.

Have you tried the Lazy Popcorns! They are such a time saver :)




Don't Repeat Row 19. This is for your reference and stitch placement only.

PART 3 - The Border

The border is a repeat of Part 2.

You simply finish on a row with fans (7 DC in 1 stitch).

You can make the border as thick as you like by finishing on any fan row.
